- English 40 credits
- Social Studies 40 credits
- Math 30 credits
- Science 20 credits
- Physical Education 20 credits
- Art/World Language 10 credits
- Electives 70 credits (7 classes)
- Community Service 35 hours

5 credits = 1 semester, 10 credits = 1 year

- Freshman are required to take a minimum of 6 courses

### A-G Requirements 4-year University Eligibility

- (A) History 2 years
- (B) English 4 years
- (C) Math 3 years (at least Algebra II) 4 years recommended
- (D) Science 2 years (1 year of life science and 1 year of physical science) 4 years recommended
- (E) Language other than English 2 years; 3 years recommended \*Same language\*
- (F) Visual/Performing Arts 1 year
- (G) College-preparatory Elective 1 year
- A-G classes require a "C" grade or higher.
- A-G College Prep/Readiness is essential!
- UC/CSU eligibility

#### Science SPG Info

\*The science department recommendation is that students all start out with Earth Science in 9th grade.

Reasons we would suggest starting in Biology are:

1) If a student wants to take AP Physics in grade 12

2) If a student wants to take multiple advanced science classes in grades 11/12. To start in Biology, students need to have met all the prerequisites.





# Building Trades & Construction (CTE)

- (CTE) Introduction to Building Construction and Trades
- (CTE) Intermediate Cabinetry, Millwork, and Woodworking
- (CTE) Advance Cabinetry, Millwork, and Woodworking (Capstone Course)
- Small Gas Engines

The Career Technical Education (CTE) Building Trades and Construction pathway includes the following courses: Introduction to Building Construction and Trades, Advanced Cabinetry, Millwork, and Woodworking as a capstone, and Intermediate Cabinetry, Millwork, and Woodworking. This pathway includes participation in SkillsUSA program is a curriculum that helps prepare students in the workplace through personal skills, workplace skills and technical skills embedded in academics. Students will also participate in SkillsUSA competitions at the Regional, State and National levels.



#### **AVID**



AVID is a program for students who want to attend a 4-year university. It's a class that requires dedication, determination, and hard work.

### Interested students must complete an AVID application.

- AVID 1
  - Designed to prepare students for the rigor involved with succeeding at a four-year university.
  - It is a 4-year commitment and you need a 2.0 GPA

#### Resource/Special Education

- Courses determined by case manager (at Middle School) based on IEP



Please have the following documents ready to upload:

- Birth Certificate
- Immunization Record
- Current Driver's License of Parent
- Proof of Residency The list below contains the acceptable items to establish residency. You only need 1 item from the list.
  - Current vehicle registration that matches the driver's license submitted
  - Current employee check stub with current address
  - Voter registration card
  - Utility bill: current electricity, gas or water bill with current address

\*In August you will need to review your enrollment information during our ANNUAL UPDATE and sign additional documents for registration ONLINE before student receives their schedule. Please write down your username and password that you create for the parent portal. You will need this to do the ANNUAL UPDATE in the fall.

You will receive an email that your application has been processed. Enrollment will not be complete and your student will not be registered if we do not receive all of the above documentation.
